Students completed a pre-draw before any instruction in the course was given. Students completed a post-draw during the last week of the semester. Four instructors (internal part-time, full-time and external) met and used a departmentally-developed rubric to score the skill development in the drawings.

Met Standard of Success: Yes

Out of the total sample of student work scored, 85% (an average score) of the sample population scored 70% (3.5) or higher for Outcome #1. Out of 50 sample student works, 49 of those works scored above 70% for learning Outcome #1.

7. Based on your interpretation of the assessment results, describe the areas of strength in student achievement of this learning outcome.

85% of students assessed developed an understanding of figure/ground relationships, linear perspective techniques and the use of line and value to describe simple and complex volumes in space.

Due to the success of the outcome, the students would continue to benefit from observational drawing to further develop their compositional skills as related to figure/ground issues. Future plans for assessment will include having all instructors treat the post-assessment drawing as a graded assignment to build student momentum/interest at the end of the semester and more consistent directives on how the pre- and post-assessment is to be administered.

during the course assessment. Discuss the extent to which students achieved this learning outcome and indicate whether the standard of success was met for this outcome and tool.

Met Standard of Success: Yes

Out of the total sample of student work scored, 85% (an average score) of the sample population scored 70% (3.5) or higher for Outcome #2. Out of 50 sample student works, 47 of those works scored above 70% for learning Outcome #2.

7. Based on your interpretation of the assessment results, describe the areas of strength in student achievement of this learning outcome.

85% of students assessed acquired manual skills with simple drawing materials. The assessors concluded that manual skills achieved were demonstrated through control of line, value of line, and weight of line used in a correct manner on the post-assessment drawing.

8. Based on your analysis of student performance, discuss the areas in which student achievement of this learning outcome could be improved. If student met standard of success, you may wish to identify your plans for continuous improvement.

As with all line drawing, there will also be room for improvement. Mastering line drawing requires consistent study over time. One of the assessors noted that some of the students were almost too careful with their line placement in the post-assessment drawing.

Met Standard of Success: Yes

Out of the total sample of student work scored, 85% (an average score) of the sample population scored 70% (3.5) or higher for Outcome #3. Out of 50 sample student works, 44 of those works scored above 70% for learning Outcome #3.

7. Based on your interpretation of the assessment results, describe the areas of strength in student achievement of this learning outcome.

85% of students assessed were able to execute accurate drawings of objects in space. The assessment team felt that the students drew from true observation rather than what they thought they saw. The ability to create observational drawings greatly accelerated over time, as noted by the assessors.

8. Based on your analysis of student performance, discuss the areas in which student achievement of this learning outcome could be improved. If student met standard of

success, you may wish to identify your plans for continuous improvement.

As with all observational drawings, there is always room for improvement. Learning to draw in an observational manner is a process that develops over time and with consistent practice. Most ART 111 students view the world in greater detail after completing this course. One assessor did question a correlation between reading and writing skills and the understanding of space in observational drawings.

Students completed a written (manual) test to assess their knowledge base of the vocabulary typically used in the fine arts basic drawing course.

Met Standard of Success: Yes

Out of the total sample of student work scored, 89% (an average score) of the sample population scored 70% (3.5) or higher for Outcome #4. Out of 50 sample student works, 49 students scored above 70% for learning Outcome #4.

7. Based on your interpretation of the assessment results, describe the areas of strength in student achievement of this learning outcome.

89% of students assessed were able to communicate their knowledge of the language of the discipline of fine arts drawing. They consistently used the discipline language in critiques and in written materials.

Consistent delivery of information and written materials by all instructors teaching this course will greatly impact the success of the outcome.
