Rationale: The CDA Council has changed the requirements for the national child care credential (CDA - Child Development Associate), and there are new state requirements to meet Quality Rating Scale requirements, necessitating changes in our courses.

Proposed Start Semester: Winter 2013

Course Description: This course provides an overview of the basic components of early child care and education. Students gain knowledge of six of the CDA competency standards: safety, health, learning environment, families, program management and professionalism. Enrollment restrictions per state child care regulations. Student must be 18 years of age with a high school diploma/GED or concurrently enrolled in a state approved vocational high school child care program to register for this course. Concurrent enrollment in CCP 132 is required. The title of this course was previously Child Development Credentialing I.

Who will score and analyze the data: Members of the CCP Advisory Committee or their designates will score the papers using the rubric and make recommendations to the program.

Who will score and analyze the data: Members of the CCP Advisory Committee or their designates will blind-score the sampled items using the rubric for each of the five resource items and make recommendations to the program.
