- 2. Identify the key events in American Labor history since 1930 that shaped the present labor movement.
- 3. Review and discuss a timeline of national and world events that affected the labor movement.
- 4. Identify early efforts to organize labor groups focusing on skilled trades.
- 5. Recognize the need for and purpose of the organized labor movement in the United States and Canada.
- 6. Compare skilled trades labor practices prior to and after 1930, including management demands and the rise of safety issues.
- 7. Identify key labor movement events from 1930 to the present day that influenced individuals, organizations and communities.
- 8. Describe the impact the labor movement had on the development of industry.
- 9. Discuss the need for education and training in skilled trades as a part of the labor movement from 1930 to the present day.
- 10. Discuss the positive impact technology has had on improving relations, education and involvement in the skilled trades labor movement.
- 11. Discuss the improvements in employees' work life based on labor movements and membership in labor unions.
- 12. Analyze the primary documents and secondary literature in current United States and Canadian labor history.
