To contact campus Safety & Security:

- From any house phone (white) dial 3411.
- From one of the security phones (red) press the red button.
- Use your cell phone to call (734) 973-3411.

QUICK SAFETY TIPS: You can help keep the campus safe by following the tips below:



General safety guidelines:

- Stay alert and be aware of your surroundings.
- Avoid isolated areas.
- Try to avoid walking alone at night. Walk with friends when possible.
- Notify Campus Safety & Security of suspicious or criminal activity.
- If an emergency arises – a serious health issue or injury, a crime, or any situation in which you feel endangered, immediately contact campus Safety & Security. There are phones located in all buildings across campus, as well as in several key areas outside.



If walking alone:

- Stay alert.
- Keep your mind on your surroundings, who's in front of you and who's behind you. Don't get distracted.
- Walk purposefully, stand tall, and make eye contact with people around you.
- TRUST YOUR INSTINCTS. If you feel uncomfortable in a situation, get away.



Secure your vehicle:

- Never leave your vehicle running while it is unattended.
- Lock your doors.
- Roll up the windows completely.
- Take your keys and never hide a spare in or on the vehicle.
- Keep out of sight all valuables and packages that may tempt a thief.
- Use auto theft deterrents such as car alarms and steering column devices.



Bicycle Security:

- Invest in a good lock, such as a U-shaped hardened steel padlock.
- Lock the bike frame and wheels to a bike rack (not trees, posts, etc.).



Computer Safety:

- Do not leave laptops, smart phones or tablets unattended.
- Record the serial number of your computer equipment.
- Use anchor security devices to lock personal computers.



In case of fire:

- Learn the locations of the emergency exits.
- Activate the fire alarm if you detect a fire in a building.
- Always exit the building in the event of a fire alarm.
- Exit by the nearest stairway. Do NOT use elevators.
- Call Campus Safety & Security (3411) from one of the college house phones to notify emergency personnel.
- If close by, press the red button on one of the red emergency phones to be directly connected to Campus Safety & Security.
