**Course Description:** In this course, students will practice the therapeutic management skills for safe and appropriate use with patients in their role as a physical therapist assistant. Lecture, demonstrations, lab practice, patient simulations, and additional resources will be used to develop decision-making and problem-solving skills with an emphasis on safety. Topics include, but are not limited to, management of the cardiac patient, wound management, pulmonary hygiene, orthotic education and management, management of the patient with an amputation including pre-prosthetic training and prosthetic management, lymphedema management, and environmental accessibility.

- 4. Analyze incorrect gait patterns and potential causes in a patient using a lower extremity prosthesis.
- 5. Explain indications, contraindications, and precautions for wound management.
- 6. Distinguish between the different types of wound dressing and the indications for use of one over another.
- 7. Devise a patient education plan for maintenance or healing of skin integrity.
- 8. Properly set up a sterile field.
- 9. Properly don, doff, and dispose of personal protective equipment, including sterile gloves, when working with a patient on wound management.
- 10. Explain indications, contraindications, and precautions of pulmonary hygiene.
- 11. Examine the different lobes of each lung and link the appropriate postural drainage position to the area of congestion.
- 12. Direct the patient in diaphragmatic, chest expansion, cough techniques, and other breathing strategies.
- 13. Devise a patient education plan for self-treatment.
- 14. Properly don, doff, and dispose of personal protective equipment when working with patients on pulmonary hygiene.
- 15. Discuss the functions of the lymphatic system.
- 16. Differentiate the stages of lymphedema classification.
- 17. Discriminate the stages of complete decongestive therapy.
- 18. Demonstrate accurate measurement of limb girth of both upper and lower extremities.
- 19. Demonstrate competence in proper pressure for manual lymphatic drainage.
- 20. Discuss precautions and contraindications of compression bandaging.
- 21. Differentiate between normal and abnormal response to therapeutic interventions.
- 22. Accurately document therapeutic intervention and patient response.
