- ***A dentist shall assign this procedure to the RDA only if the RDA has successfully completed an approved course as defined in section 16611 (7) of the act.

LEVELS OF SUPERVISION

The definitions that follow are taken from the Administrative Rules of the Michigan Board of Dentistry.

A = ASSIGNMENT means that a dentist has designated a patient of record upon whom services are to be performed by an assistant, registered dental assistant, or registered dental hygienist and has described the procedure to be performed. The dentist need not be physically present in the office or in the treatment room at the time the procedures are being performed.

G = GENERAL SUPERVISION - means that a dentist has designated a patient of record upon whom services are to be performed. The dentist shall be physically present in the office during the performance of the procedures.

D = DIRECT SUPERVISON - means that a dentist has designated a patient of record upon whom services are to be performed by a dental assistant, registered dental assistant or licensed dental hygienist and has described the procedures to be performed. The dentist shall examine the patient before prescribing the procedure to be performed and again upon completion of the procedure. The licensed dentist shall be physically present in the office at the time procedures are being performed.
